Her honors and awards include a Fiction Syndicate Prize, two Pushcart Special Mentions, Writer in Residence at Headlands Center for the Arts (Sausalito, CA) and Hedgebrook Retreat for Women Writers (Whidbey Is., WA), a Blumenthal Award, and Sarah Belk Gambrell Artist Educator of the Year. She is a graduate of American University and holds an MFA in Creative Writing from Warren Wilson College.
